

Online Tool Checklist

This Online Tool Checklist will help you determine the suitability of online tools for your setting. The questions on the checklist are designed to help you choose a tool to use with your language learners. For example you may be looking at certain web-conferencing technology, chat programs, blogging tools, audio recording software, photo sharing website, or any other technology that can help your online course or activity.

With each tool you evaluate, if the majority of your answers to the questions on the checklist are yes, then the tool is probably useful. If the majority of the answers are no, then you may want to keep exploring for a more suitable technology.

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The Online Tool Checklist on the next page looks at four main areas when choosing online tools.

- 1. How will the tool benefit learners?
- 2. What are the alternatives?
- 3. What are the privacy and payment options?
- 4. Is the tool intuitive to learn and use?
