Mursal takes off her gloves and puts her warm hands over her ears.





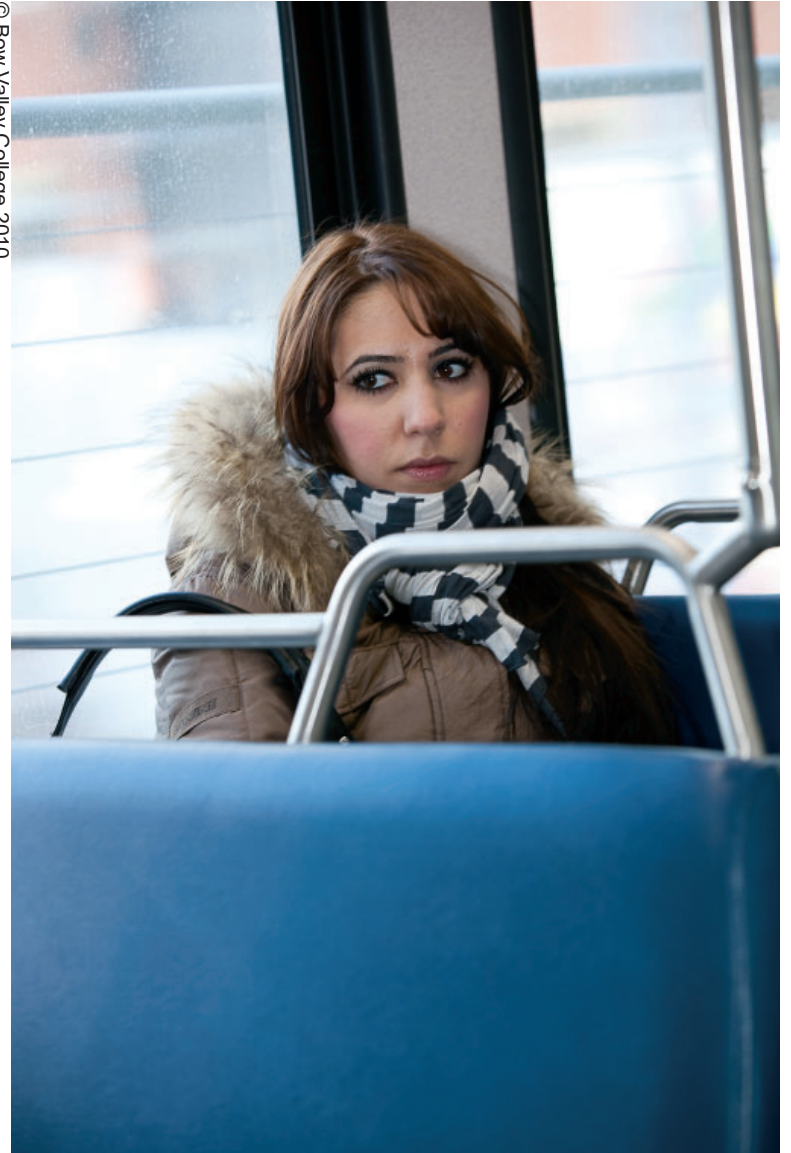
In a few minutes, her ears are warm, but they burn.
